GOING HOME BATHROOM BASKETS

Ann delivered 12 Going Home Bathroom Baskets to the Hope House Center for Women and Children. These should last for one a week until April. Another delivery is scheduled for March.

Middletown Soroptimist International Hope House Center for Women and Children Service Project

In January 2019, we began providing a "Sweet Dreams of Home Bathroom Basket" with items that women and children leaving the Hope House homeless shelter would need to set up a bathroom in their new home. We started with the goal of 2-3 baskets/month initially and then increased it to 4/month based on the number of women being dismissed from the facility monthly. We purchased, prepared and delivered 48 fully stocked "Sweet Dreams of Home Bathroom Baskets in 2019. During that time the new Director and staff established criteria that the women must meet to qualify and receive the basket. The Director has shared with us that the ladies living there are really excited about being able to work toward this incentive gift. In 2020 and 2021 the numbers dropped to about half with the COVID pandemic and the decline in admissions/discharges from the facility. The numbers have returned with about 4/month being discharged this fall.

We estimate the Sweet Dreams of Home Bathroom Baskets are valued at \$65-75 each. The fully stocked baskets include:

- 1. Laundry Basket \$4/basket this year
- 2. Bucket \$1.25 (donated in the past)
- 3. Small trash can 1.25
- 4. Mop varies from year to year about \$9
- 5. Broom \$1.25
- 6. Dust pan \$1.25
- 7. Toilet bowl brush \$1.25
- 8. 2 cleaning cloths bought by the bundle and divided
- 9. Shower curtain and hooks \$1.25 each
- 10.2 new towels/2 hand-towels/4-wash cloths varies from year to year \$10-15/bundle
- 11.10-12+ hangers donated by members/purchased some at Walmart 18 pack for \$2.98
- 12. Liquid hand soap \$1.00
- 13. Toilet bowl cleaner \$1.25
- 14. Window cleaner \$1.25
- 15. General cleaner \$1.25
- 16. Air Freshener \$.98
- 17.8 rolls of toilet paper 2 packs at \$1.25 each
- 18.1 roll of paper towels \$1.66 this year for big roll from COSTCO (individually wrapped)
- 19. Pack of 4 toothbrushes \$1.00
- 20.Tooth paste \$1.00
- 21. Pack of 4-6 razors \$1.00
- 22. Shaving cream \$1.25
- 23.Pkg of maxi pads
- 24.Shampoo \$.88
- 25.Conditioner \$.88
- 26.Body Wash \$1.25
- 27.A bar of soap bought in bundle and divided up-can usually find some on sale

28. From time to time there are other member donated items randomly included in a basket on a limited basis, i.e., hair dryers, scented soaps, shower curtains with matching rings, soap/lotion basket, travel packs, etc.

We use tax exempt status on all purchases except those at COSTCO and Kohls (have not been successful in getting Non-profit status at those two stores. Most \$1.25 items bought from Dollar Tree (can't buy baskets or mops there as they are terrible quality and would fall apart after the first use). Some items are bught at Menards with 11% discounts and tax exempt. Most of the towels are bought at WalMart now when on sale with tax exempt status. (Sometimes I can get the bath towels there for \$3.00 each, hand towels for \$2, and wash cloths for \$1. I usually check whenever I'm in WalMart to see if they have any on sale but sometimes I have to go to several stores to put together the matching/coordinating sets. And they are not always marked down at all stores.)

With the growth of this project we have written and received 2 grants in recent years, have received several private donations, and had a corporate sponsor one year which helped us cover some of our expenses for basket supplies. Please keep this in mind and pass on any possible foundation, donor or sponsor ideas to Sue Willis, Gayle Martz, or Ann Munafo. We have 2-3 members who have grant writing experience and could always use additional financial support which would leave more of our fundraising dollars for our other projects.
