How to Use Cellular Data for Automatic App Downloads (iOS 17)

When downloading apps, your iPhone has the ability to either use cellular data or to only download apps while your device has access to Wi-Fi. If you do not have an unlimited data plan, you may want to disable downloads using cellular data to ensure you're not wasting data unknowingly. However, being able to download apps when you don't have access to Wi-Fi can also be extremely useful. In today's tip, we're going how to change the download settings on iPhone to either enable or disable downloads over cellular. You can decide what you prefer based on your data plan and Wi-Fi availability.

- 1. Open **Settings**
- 2. Tap App Store
- 3. Toggle **Automatic Downloads** on or off under Cellular Data

Apple Universal Clipboard: Copy & Paste Between Devices

If you have multiple Apple devices, you can copy or cut something from one device and paste it to the other. This productivity feature is extremely helpful for starting something on one device and completing it on the other device. Apple calls this the Universal Clipboard, and the feature couldn't be easier to use.

This tip will work on iPhone SE (gen 1) or later running iOS 10 or later, iPad (gen 5) or later running iPadOS 10 or later, and Macs running macOS Sierra or later.

In order for Universal Clipboard to work smoothly, make sure all your devices are connected to Wi-Fi and are logged in to the same Apple ID account. Next, you will want to make sure AirPlay & Handoff is turned on in your iPhone's settings. To do this:

- 1. Open Settings
- 2. Tap General
- 3. Tap **AirPlay & Handoff** Toggle **Handoff** on and off

Or you may have **Automatically AirPlay** to select **Never, Ask or Automatic**And **Handoff** to turn on.

You can also follow these steps to turn on Handoff on your iPad.

Similarly, click on **General** in **System Settings** on your Mac to ensure **Handoff** is toggled on.

Now that you've made sure you're logged in to your Apple ID on all devices, and you've turned on Handoff, you should be able to copy, cut, and paste between various devices.

- 1. Highlight the text or image you want to copy or cut
- 2. Tap Cut or Copy depending on your needs.
- 3. Now, open up your Mac or iPad to the place you want to paste.
- 4. Click Paste.

HOPE HOUSE BASKET UPDATE

January 2, 2024

Hope House Basket update: Twelve "Going Home Bathroom Baskets" were delivered on December 12th to Hope House for women leaving the shelter over the next 3 months. It was exciting to add a few extra items to the baskets that were delivered and the 3 they still had in storage. For those who were at our wonderful Christmas party at the Willis home this will not be new information. Hope House recently received a major donation of items from Miami Valley Gaming Casino. Since Hope House has so little storage space they asked if we would store some of the items and add them to our baskets over the next year or so. I went back to Hope House on 12/14 to meet the delivery truck and bring the donations to my house. Hope House did keep several additional boxes of these items to give to the men living at their facility. In all we received and brought to my house:

- 90 queen size sheet sets (25 used in baskets already and will still have some for 2024-25 baskets)
- 15 gueen size comforters (all placed in baskets in storage now at Hope House)
- 24 rotating sweepers (non-electric)
- 24 stick vacuums (electric)
- 16 spray mops

Yes, I have them stored in my basement presently but I do have the space so its not so bad. I did take 15 sheets and 15 comforters back to Hope House on 12/26 and placed them in the baskets I had delivered the week before. I also prepared 10 additional

baskets should they be needed before I come back from my Florida trip. Sue Willis very graciously agreed to store them and deliver them to Hope House if needed. After that we still have 4 more baskets at my home to finish out this year. Which will make a total of 38 baskets donated for 2023-24 through August of 2024. I have shared information with the board about ways to reduce our costs

so we can continue this project in the future. Certainly, receiving the mops and sweepers is a great way for us to reduce some of our expenses for mops, brooms, and dustpans. We are scheduled to discuss this more at our January meeting and I'm preparing a report for the board with some changes I've made in the baskets and items to decrease our total cost per basket. I'm happy to report that we have received a couple recent donations to help us move ahead with this program for next year. More details from Sue about that in her December financial report. I will be available by phone for this discussion at the January meeting.

Another interesting piece of information that I learned about this month is that someone is now making baskets for the men who are leaving the Hope House shelter. Seems we started a good thing in our community and now even more people are receiving support to help reduce homelessness.
