## **Queen Elizabeth II**

Queen Elizabeth II served as head of the <u>royal family</u> for 70 years, making her the longest-reigning monarch in British history. She celebrated her Platinum Jubilee in June 2022, just three months before she passed away at 96 years old.

## Ruth Bader Ginsburg

April 10—general meeting

Ginsburg made history as the first Jewish woman to be appointed to the Supreme Court. Her entire career was highlighted with pivotal moments in American history. Consistently standing up for gender equality and civil rights, she helped pass historic rulings on topics ranging from the Affordable Care Act to the legalization of same-sex marriage before her 2020 death at age 87.

This is the book Betty mentioned at our meeting. For some reason I can't copy and paste the photo of the cover into this newsletter. Instead of pulling all my hair out, I'll just send it in a separate email.

A must-read for all parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, and even teens and preteens: the generation-defining investigation into the collapse of youth mental health in the

era of smartphones, social media, and big tech—and a plan for a healthier, freer childhood.

After more than a decade of stability or improvement, the mental health of adolescents plunged in the early 2010s. Rates of depression, anxiety, self-harm, and suicide rose sharply, more than doubling on many measures. Why?
