Soroptimist was formed in 1921 in Oakland, California, at a time when women were not permitted to join service organizations. The name Soroptimist was coined from the Latin soror meaning sister, and optima meaning best. And so, Soroptimist is perhaps best interpreted as 'the best for women'.
